#### Safety Meeting Follow-Up with Major Gaines

In follow-up to the February 4th Safety Meeting with BPD Central District Major Daryl Gaines along with his support team, below are the **Safety Tips** as requested during the meeting:

- When walking, please do not get so distracted by your cell phone that you're not paying attention to your surroundings.
- Try not to walk with your cell phone up to your face or in your hands if possible. Keep it in your pocket or out of sight.
- Walk in well-lit areas whenever possible.
- Please do not walk down the street holding your car keys in your hand. If possible, try to keep them in your pocket and try to get into the habit of unlocking your car doors while your keys are still in your pocket. Familiarize yourself with your vehicle's remote control features.
- Separate your vehicle and house keys.
- If you think you're being followed, go into an open business if possible and let someone know.
- Do not leave items or empty boxes inside of your vehicle in plain sight.
- Do not leave any valuable items in your vehicle overnight.
- Always make sure someone is aware where you are going. When possible, utilize your smartphones feature and share your location with someone you can trust.
- Invest in a doorbell security camera system of your choice (cannot recommend brand).
- If you have a home alarm system, please make sure you set the alarm when you leave home.
- If you see someone or something suspicious, please make sure you notify the police.
- Use your smartphone to take pictures of your electronic devices' serial numbers:
   computers, televisions, smartphones, tablets, etc. (When purchasing these items, the
   serial number can be located on the box with the bar code). Once you have photographs
   of your serial numbers, be sure to email them to yourself and to save the photographs to
   the cloud---that way they are available if needed.

Thread is a non-profit organization that has worked to support under-performing Baltimore City High School students for the past 15 years. They enroll 9th grade students who rank in the bottom 25% of their class and face an abundance of challenges outside the classroom, connecting them with up to 5 volunteers (a Thread family) who provide them with continuous support and increased access to community resources for 10 years. Once enrolled, Thread commits to never giving up on a single student and their students consistently defy the odds.

# Baltimore City Council Legislative & Community Updates

Below are the recent legislative updates by Baltimore City Council:

Council President Scott recently introduced a <u>Charter Amendment that would remove</u>
 the appointed members of the Board of Estimates, reducing the size from 5 to 3

 members. Per President Brandon Scott: "Reducing the Board of Estimates to the three elected members, all with equal weight to approve or reject City contracts involving

taxpayer dollars, is one way we can clean up City government and make it more efficient and more supportive of our local communities."

- Council President Scott continues to work on implementing his <u>Legislative and Policy</u>
   <u>Proposal (2019-2020)</u>. Several policies are making their way through the legislative process with three signed into law. You can find an update on the status of these policies in the <u>Policy Tracker</u>.

  youth engagement grant that provides support to neighborhood organizations by providing
  funding for youth to engage in activities that directly affect the cleanliness and beatification

- The Community Law Center has a <u>Tax Workshop for Nonprofits</u> on March 27, 2020 from 12-1 or 6-7pm.
- Baltimore City Recreation & Parks (BCRP) has launched <u>Recreation 2025</u>, their five-year strategic plan.
- Strong City Baltimore is holding their <u>Neighborhood Institute 2020 "Building Civic</u>
   <u>Power"</u> on March 28, 2020.
- The South Baltimore Gateway Partnership is holding <u>A Community Capacity Building</u>
   <u>Conference</u> on Friday April 3, 2020 from 8:30-5pm at the Horseshoe Casino. This
   workshop gives priority to organizations in South Baltimore, but is open to groups in the
   entire City.
- The <u>2020 Census</u> is in April, and Baltimore wants to make sure that Everyone Counts.
   Accurate census numbers impact funding and representation for Baltimore. It is important that everyone participates in the Census.

#### Winter Weather Reminders

#### from Baltimore City

With winter weather here---despite no snow, Baltimore City reminds everyone of the following:

 Residents are responsible for removing snow from the sidewalk in front of your house.

Per City Code, snow removal is required within 3 hours after the end of a snow or ice event unless the snowfall stops between 3pm-6am, in which case snow must be removed by 11am. Failure to shovel the snow from the sidewalk in front of your property can result in fines from the City.

- BPD reminds you not start your car and go back inside to let it warm up. It's against the
  law to leave your car running with no one inside, which can result in a fine, and it
  increases potential for robbery. BPD also reminds everyone not to leave anything in your
  car and to make sure that it is locked.
- DPW reminds you that on days/nights where the temperatures are to drop below freezing to have your faucet on the lowest level on a drip to prevent pipes from freezing.

# 65th Annual St. Patrick's Day Parade


