

Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19) Information

Baltimore City continues to deal with the impact of COVID-19. As of January 16th, Baltimore City has 35,400 COVID-19 cases and 693 deaths. For health resources on the virus, the City, State and Federal Government all have information on their websites:

Mayor Scott's Phase I Restrictions Continue

Baltimore City continues to remain under Phase I restrictions per Mayor Scott's executive order effective December 11th. Under the executive order, the following restrictions continue to be in place:

Gatherings: Indoor gatherings at public and private facilities will be limited to no more than 10 persons.

Outdoor gatherings at public and private facilities will be limited to no more than 25 persons. Sports gatherings at Recreation & Parks are prohibited.

Religious Facilities: Limited to 25% of maximum occupancy.

Retail Establishments and Malls: Limited to 25% of maximum occupancy. Businesses with a BD7 or D tavern license and with a separate packaged goods section can keep that section open at 25% of maximum capacity.

Indoor Recreational Establishments: Closed including adult entertainment venues and clubs and the non-retail activities at Hookah and Cigar establishments.

Outdoor Recreational Establishments: Limited to 25% of maximum occupancy.

Foodservice Establishments: Closed to indoor & outdoor dining. This includes bars, restaurants, nightclubs, breweries, and tour boat dining. *Carry-out, delivery and drive-through service may continue.* Businesses with a BD7 or D tavern license and with a separate packaged goods section can keep that section open at 25% of maximum capacity.

Fitness Centers: Limited to 25% of maximum occupancy, that is limited to individual fitness only; *group-fitness activities prohibited*.

Casinos: Limited to 25% of maximum occupancy; Open for gaming only, food and beverage services prohibited.

Personal Services: Limited to 25% of maximum occupancy. Staff must wear face coverings at all times while indoors. Services must be provided on an appointment-only basis, and a log must be kept of names of customers, staff providing services, and other residents who enter the shop.

Libraries: May continue to operate with curbside pickup service.

Museums, Zoos, Aquariums: Limited to 25% of maximum occupancy.

Theaters and Outdoor Entertainment Venues: Closed.

Live Performances: Prohibited

As previously announced by the Mayor and Health Commissioner, the City's Health Order <u>requires residents to wear face-coverings</u>.

Residential Permit Parking Enforcement Still No Changes at this time!

As mentioned before, the Baltimore City Department of Transportation resumed parking enforcement of Residential Permit Parking on Tuesday, September 1st.

Permits that expired after March 2020 will be honored until the Governor lifts the Emergency Order.

Residents who live at an eligible RPP address can apply online immediately at pabc.thepermitstore.com for a new permit if you meet one of the following criteria:

- You are a new RPP customer who has not been able to purchase a permit due to the COVID-19 closure of PABC offices.
- You are an existing customer who has purchased a new vehicle or has new plates.
- You are an existing customer who moved from one RPP area to another. If you moved
 within the same RPP area, you may continue to use the decal and visitor permit(s) you
 already have.

Residents who qualify can apply immediately online at pabe:thepermitstore.com to have a permit mailed to them. The online application will allow residents to upload the required documents that are usually verified in person at the Parking Authority Office or at a Community Pickup. A Parking Authority team member will verify the documents online and mail residents their permits.

The Parking Authority Office, located at 200 W. Lombard Street, is now open on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays from 8:30 am to 4:30 pm. Extended late-night hours and Saturday hours will not be available. The office will be open for residents who do not have online access or experience problems with the website.

For the safety of the Parking Authority employees and customers, the office will open with the following restrictions:

- There will be a maximum of five customers allowed in the office at a time. Please form a line outside along the wall until you are called to come in.
- A mask or face covering must be worn at all times.
- A health screening will be required in the Arena Garage lobby closest to our office main entrance before you may enter the PABC office. If you do not pass the health screening, entry will be denied.
- Hand sanitizer will be available. Please use some when you enter.
- Please do not walk up to any employee desk. Please have a seat and wait to be called, as
 employees must wipe down surfaces between each customer.

Welcome State Delegate Marlon Amprey

Please join us in welcoming Marlon Amprey as the newly appointed District 40 State Delegate.

On December 29, 2020, the Baltimore City Democratic State Central Committee nominated Marlon Amprey (D) to the Maryland House of Delegates to represent District 40. Governor Larry Hogan (R) approved the nomination and formally appointed Delegate Amprey to the seat on January 6th to be effective January 13th.

Delegate Amprey succeeds Nick Mosby (D), who resigned in December 2020 when he was sworn in as Baltimore City Council President. Prior to his appointment, Delegate Amprey worked as an associate with the law firm Cole Schotz P.C. He also worked previously as a teacher.



DPW Christmas Tree Disposal

DPW is offering curbside tree collection through Saturday, February 6th . Residents should set out trees on their regularly scheduled trash collection day, and the same location where their trash is collected. As a reminder, all tinsel and ornaments must be removed from trees before they are set out for curbside collection, or brought in for mulching.

Winter Weather Reminders from Baltimore City

With winter weather now here, Baltimore City reminds everyone of the following:

 Residents are responsible for removing snow from the sidewalk in front of your house.

Per City Code, snow removal is required within 3 hours after the end of a snow or ice event unless the snowfall stops between 3pm-6am, in which case snow must be removed by 11am. Failure to shovel the snow from the sidewalk in front of your property can result in fines from the City.

- BPD reminds you not start your car and go back inside to let it warm up. It's against the
 law to leave your car running with no one inside, which can result in a fine, and it
 increases potential for robbery. BPD also reminds everyone not to leave anything in your
 car and to make sure that it is locked.
- DPW reminds you that on days/nights where the temperatures are to drop below freezing to have your faucet on the lowest level on a drip to prevent pipes from freezing.

Bag Ban Implementation Postponed

On January 6th, Mayor Scott signed an <u>Executive Order</u> postponing implementation of the <u>Comprehensive Bag Reduction Ordinance</u> in response to the continuous impact of COVID-19 on residents and businesses.

The Ordinance, commonly known as Baltimore's Plastic Bag Ban, was originally slated for implementation on January 13th. The executive order suspends the date of implementation until July 9th of this year, with the possibility of extension. This will ban single-use plastic bags at the point of sale, pickup, or delivery. Baltimore businesses must charge at least \$0.05 for each alternative bag distributed at check out, of which \$0.01 will be remitted to the city. Businesses and residents are encouraged to visit the Baltimore Office of Sustainability's website for additional information.

Now is a great time to start stocking up on reusable bags and helping spread the word!
